Samuel Dinsmoor 1789, Governor of NH and ex-off. Dartmouth Trustee (1831-1834), U.S. Congress

Perley Howe 1790, Pastor of the Congregational Church in Surry, NH (1795-1840)

Thomas Green Fessenden 1796, Inventor, Poet, Editor of various newspapers and journals including *The New England Farmer and Horticultural Register* in Boston

Amos Twitchell 1802, Medical Doctor, President of NH Medical Society, Fellow of the Medical College of Philadelphia and Honorary member of the Massachusetts Medical Society

Otis Hutchins 1804, Teacher at Chesterfield Academy

Asa Rand 1806, Pastor, Editor of various newspapers, noted Abolitionist

Joel Parker 1811, NH State Legislator (1824-1826), Justice of NH Supreme Court (1833-1848, appointed Chief Justice in 1838), Dartmouth Trustee (1843-1860)

Joseph Perry 1811, Teacher, Clerk in US Treasury, Postal Service, and Principal Clerk in the Inspection office

Seth Payson, Minister, Dartmouth College Trustee, 1813-1820

Edmund Parker, Probate Judge, Dartmouth College Trustee, 1828-1856

Samuel Dinsmoor 1814, Governor of NH and ex-off. Dartmouth Trustee (1849-1852)

Rev. Zedekiah Barstow, Dartmouth Trustee for 37 years (1834-1871), pastor of the Congregational Church in Keene 1818-68

John Chamberlain 1823, Lawyer, Representative to NY Assembly, Probate Judge, County Judge

Salmon Portland Chase 1826, US Senate (1849-1855), Governor of Ohio (1855-1859), Secretary of the US Treasury (1861-1864), Chief Justice of the US Supreme Court (1865-1873)

George Cooke 1832, President of the University of Tennessee, 1852-1858

Frederick Smith Ainsworth 1840, Physician and Surgeon in the Civil War, Professor of Physiology and Pathology at Berkshire Medical School, Practiced medicine in Boston, MA

Broughton Davis Harris 1845, Editor of Brattleboro Eagle, Senator in VT Legislature

George Ticknor 1847, Editor and Senior Proprietor of New Hampshire Sentinel

Silas Hardy 1854, Probate Judge, 1864-1874

William Haile, Manufacturer, President of NH Senate (1855), Governor of NH and ex-off. Dartmouth Trustee (1857-1859)

Samuel Lankton Gerould 1858, Pastor of Congregational Church in Stoddard, Sergeant in 14<sup>th</sup> Regiment of the NH Volunteers
